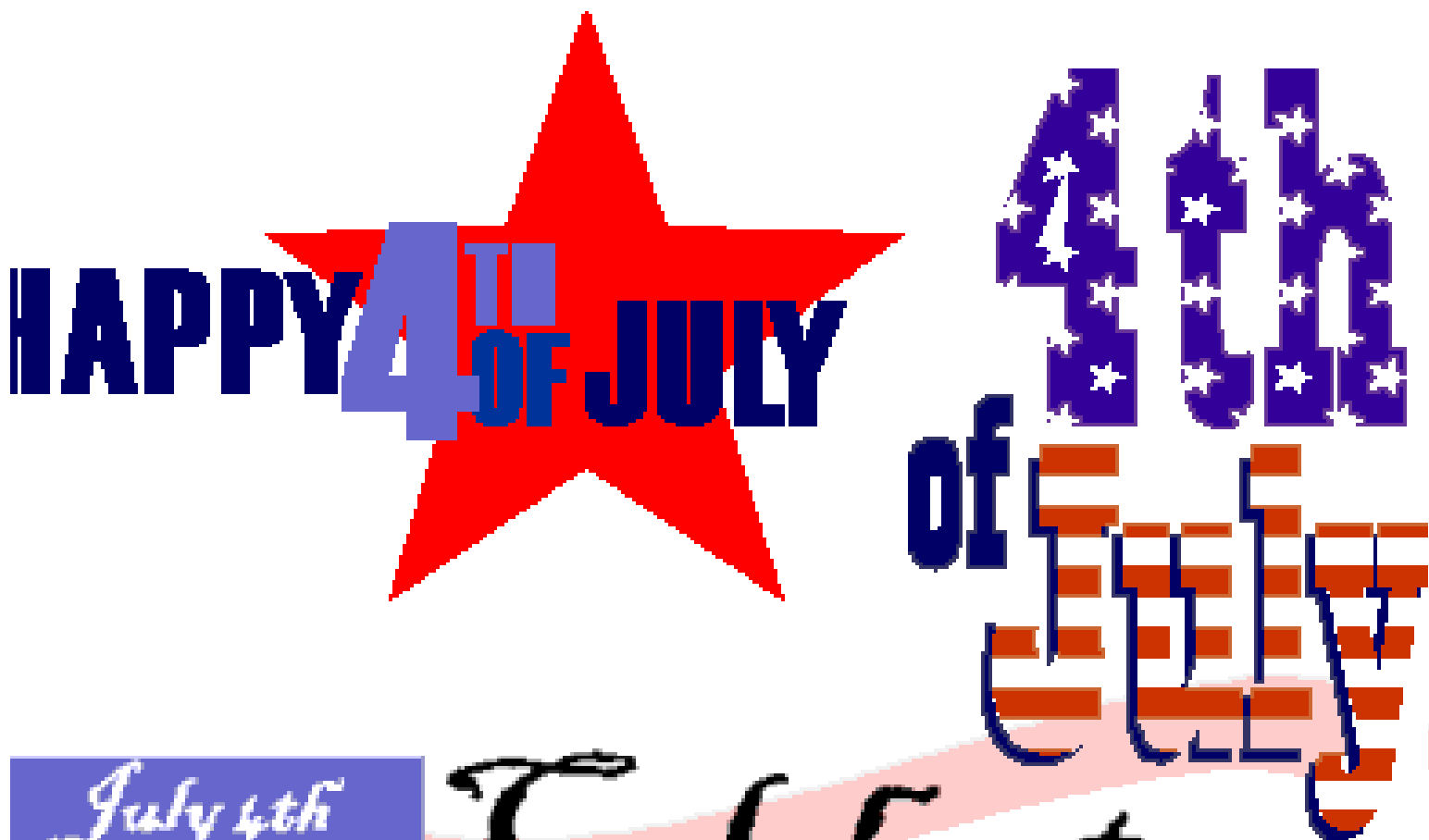

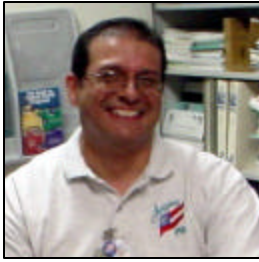

- Information on and assistance with problems concerning government benefits, consumer affairs, housing, wills, probates, guardianships and other legal matters.
- Referrals to appropriate agencies or other legal service providers.
- Referrals to private attorneys for pro bono and reduced fee representation.
- Visits to those elderly with legal problems who are confined to homes, hospitals or nursing homes.

To qualify for the **Law Project's** services, a person must be 60 years of age or older and live in Maricopa County. There are no income guidelines, but federal regulations provide that priority be given to those senior citizens who have the greatest

The **Law Project** does not charge for any of its services. Donations, however, are accepted and appreciate.

Paralyzed Veterans of America -- Initiatives on Multiple Sclerosis

Approximately 20% of Paralyzed Veterans of America's members have MS. While Paralyzed Veterans has always been committed to programs to treat MS issues, its engagement deepened in 1998 when its national board passed a resolution to improve care for veterans with MS within the Department of Veterans Affairs Health Administration. What follows is a history of some of the initiatives Paralyzed Veterans has taken over the years to address the needs of its members with MS.

In 1988, Paralyzed Veterans was one of the founding members of the Center for Neuroscience and Regeneration Research at Yale University, which supports nearly 40 scientists from around the world focusing on restoration and preservation of function in people with spinal cord injury and MS. The Center uses state-of-the-art technologies in molecular biology, genomics, pharmacology, cell biology, and other specialized scientific techniques in its research. Since its founding, Paralyzed Veterans has provided annual support, and in 2007, contributed \$300,000 to the Center's research. In addition, over the last two years Paralyzed Veterans contributed an additional \$250,000 for expansion of the center to create new clinical research space.

Under an agreement between the two organizations, the National MS Society refers all inquiries from veterans with MS to Paralyzed Veterans, which has developed unique expertise in helping these veterans obtain their benefits from the Department of Veterans Affairs. In addition, Paralyzed Veterans has partnered with the NMSS in a longitudinal study of the health care and biological characteristics of individuals with MS.

As a result of advocacy by Paralyzed Veterans, Congress has authorized permanent support for the two VA MS Centers of Excellence, one on the East Coast and one on the West Coast, which coordinate care for veterans with MS throughout the VA's 182 medical centers. Paralyzed Veterans' advocacy also led to Congressional authorization of the VA's Parkinson's Disease Research and Education Center.

Paralyzed Veterans is a member of the Consortium of MS Centers and contributes support to the Consortium's annual conference. Together with the United Spinal Association, Paralyzed Veterans provided organizational backing and funding to form a VA Special Interest Group (VA-SIG), which is a voluntary network of VA clinicians who provide MS care. Through an annual meeting and frequent teleconferences, VA-SIG works to bridge the gap between the VA and civilian sectors involved in promoting MS research and treatment. Paralyzed Veterans also publishes a quarterly electronic newsletter on MS for the VA-SIG.

Over the years, the PVA Research Foundation has provided grants for research that advances the understanding of the causes and treatments for MS. In addition, the PVA Education Foundation has funded educational projects that benefit both health care professionals and consumers. For example, in the last few years, the Education Foundation has supported several series of one-day workshops for occupational and physical therapists on treatment of fatigue and spasticity. Filming of these workshops spreads their reach to even wider audiences.

In 2006, at the request of its National President, Paralyzed Veterans initiated an Ad Hoc Planning Committee to focus on MS, pursuant to the 1998 board resolution. As a result of the Committee's efforts, MS program-building was made a key element of Paralyzed Veterans' 5-year health care plan.

Paralyzed Veterans' initially published MS: A Self-Care Guide to Wellness in 1998 and collaborated with Demos Medical Publishing Inc. in 2005 to publish a second edition.

From 1997-2002, Paralyzed Veterans provided financial and administrative support to the Multiple Sclerosis Council for Clinical Practice Guidelines, a group of 21 MS-related organizations, to produce six publications:

- Fatigue and MS (for health care professionals)
- Fatigue and MS: What You Should Know (for consumers)
- Urinary Dysfunction and MS
- Immunizations and MS
- Disease-Modifying Therapies and MS
- Spasticity and MS

In 2003, Paralyzed Veterans collaborated with the National MS Society, supported by funding from the National Endowment for Financial Education, to publish Adapting: Financial Planning for a Life with MS.

In 2007, Paralyzed Veterans has developed a public service announcement aimed to increase awareness of Paralyzed Veterans role with veterans with MS.

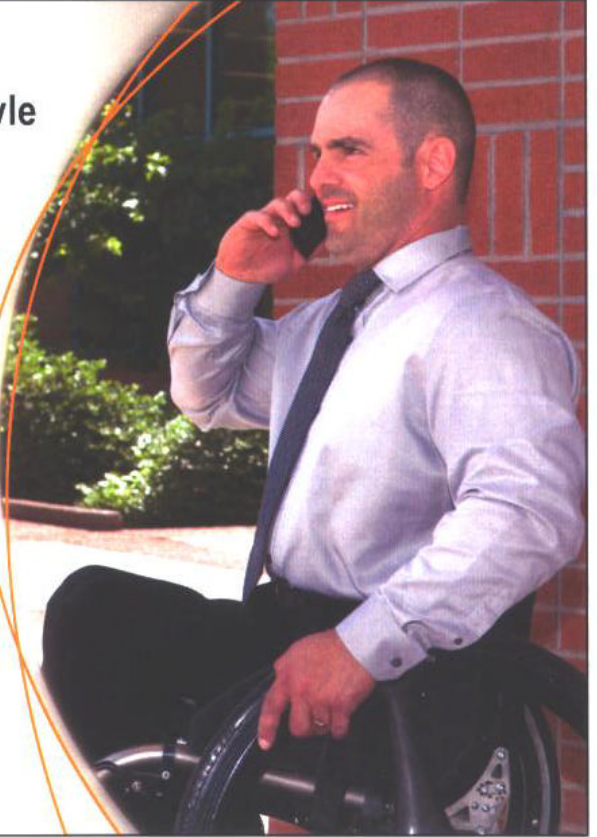
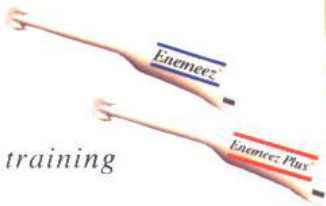
